Khanduri, Kamini. Polar Wildlife (Usborne World Wildlife). New York: Scholastic Inc., 1994. Read fascinating facts about the animals at the top and bottom of the world.

Resnick, Jane. Penguins (Eyes on Nature). Chicago: KidsBooks, 1997. Learn facts about many different penguin species and their behavior.
