Byles, Monica. *Life in the Polar Lands: Animals, People, Plants.* New York: Scholastic, 1990.

Learn about the inhabitants of the polar regions through facts and photos.

Darling, Kathy. *Arctic Babies.* New York: Scholastic, 1996.

A photographic introduction to baby animals of the Arctic written for young readers.

Green, Jen. *Polar Animals.* Bath: Parragon Publishing, 2000.

Affordable non-fiction in an appealing Q&A format.

Hynes, Margaret. *Polar Lands.* Boston: Kingfisher Publications, 2005.

Kid-friendly, photo-rich nonfiction. Accessible and appealing to children. Information on animals, plants and people of the polar lands.

Johnson, Jinny. *Amazing Penguins and Other Polar Creatures.* New York: Cartwheel Books (Scholastic Inc.), 1996.

A sticker book with 6-foot long poster, featuring penguins and other animals of the polar lands.

Joosee, Barbara. *Mama, Do You Love Me?* San Francisco: Chronicle Books, 1991.

Inuit culture and Arctic animals are introduced in this reassuring story about a parent's enduring love.

Khanduri, Kamini. *Polar Wildlife (Usborne World Wildlife).* New York: Scholastic Inc., 1994.

Read fascinating facts about the animals at the top and bottom of the world.

Stonehouse, Bernard. *The Poles (Nature Unfolds).* New York: Crabtree Publishers, 2001.

Packed with facts and realistic illustrations, it contains fold outs of both the Arctic and Antarctic.

Thompson, Lauren. *Polar Bear Night.* New York: Scholastic Press, 2004.

The luminous linocut illustrations and "just-right" text pair beautifully in this lulling bedtime story. It's also an introduction to Arctic animals for young readers.

Wood, Jenny. *Icebergs.* New York: Scholastic Inc., 1990.

Nonfiction packed with photos, including Arctic and Antarctic animals that live on the ice.

Walters, Martin and Johnson, Jinny. *Animals of the World.* New York: Barnes & Noble Books, 2002.

An excellent resource packed with facts and grouped by related species (e.g. flightless birds – ostriches, emus, cassowaries, rheas).
